With the onset of remote working, online and hybrid technologies, the Campus University survey gathers students' preferences and experiences on formats of education and which would be better suited to the learning activities in their programme. The responses will help TU Delft better understand what it means to be a campus university.

Survey Insights

- Most respondents prefer hybrid or blended formats specifically for Lectures, Group and Individual Assignments, and Feedback & Queries; For it's ability to accommodate disabilities, various schedules, and the freedom to choose the most appropriate form of education for oneself.
- More students preferred face-to-face interactions for Lab Work, Presentations and Exams.

Many students value the interactive and engaging aspects of in-person learning. They appreciate the opportunity to ask questions more easily, have quick back-and-forth discussions, and receive immediate feedback from both the lecturer and fellow classmates. In-person learning also allows for better communication, interpersonal skills development, and the utilization of university facilities. Students enjoy the social interaction, non-verbal cues, and the sense of being part of a community. In-person learning also helps with concentration and reduces distractions from screens. Overall, students find in-person learning to be a more interactive, engaging, and fulfilling academic experience.

"During COVID I was never able to follow online lectures, as I did not have the concentration and motivation. Being in the lecture hall ensures that I pay attention."

"It is easier to share doubts / be vulnerable with a supervisor in a face-to-face conversation." -Nanobiology Student

Live streaming offers flexibility and the ability to choose between attending lectures online or in person. A hybrid set up enables international guests to be easily invited and optimizes time spent at the campus. Students value the convenience and freedom to choose the most suitable mode of attendance based on their circumstances. Hybrid education can also accommodate disabilities and scheduling conflicts, allowing for greater inclusion and flexibility.

Blended

Students also refer to hybrid education as a combination of online and on-campus learning which we define as blended education. Students appreciate the option to re-watch recordings of lectures, have face-to-face question sessions, or attend physical meetings while still having online forums for quick questions. It allows for a personalized learning experience, combining the benefits of both online and in-person interactions.

"Some things are more effective when we work individually and remotely, others require discussion and drawing together. I prefer meeting the group once every week or two weeks for a meaningful meeting, and after that communicate remotely."

Online education provides flexibility, allowing students to work at their own pace. It allows for fitting education into their schedules more easily. Online resources and forums provide accessibility and allow for questions to be answered at any time. It offers the convenience of combining education with other tasks and plans, eliminates travel time, and allows for a more personalized daily structure. However, challenges such as decreased concentration and motivation when working from home may arise. Overall, online education offers logistical convenience and the ability to adapt to individual routines and habits.



However, a mix of face-to-face and online supervision or the option to choose between the two is appreciated for flexibility, timely feedback, and the ability to address different aspects of supervision effectively.
