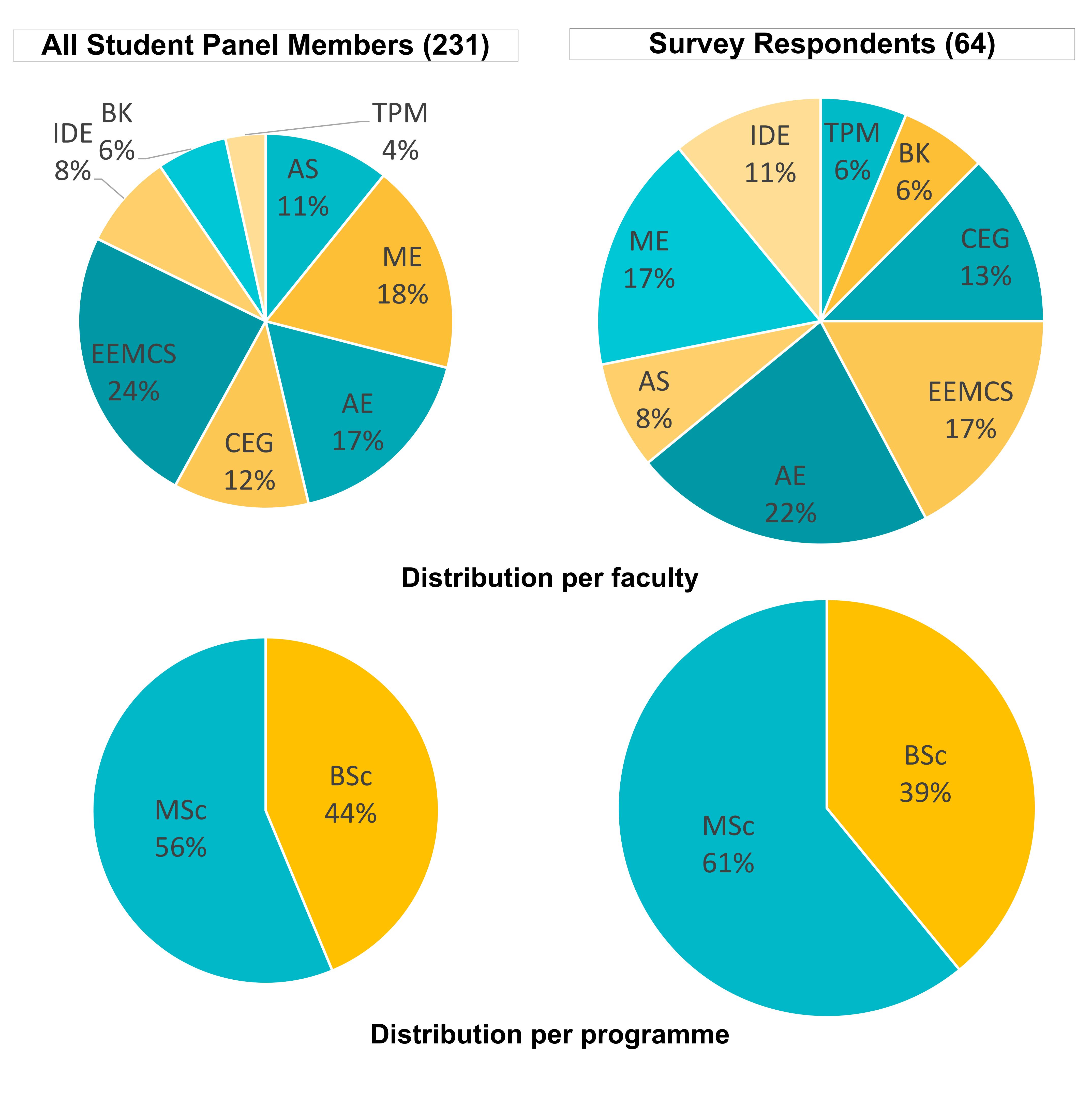
Topic of research

A campus community platform is a phone application or website where a variety of information about campus life can be found, and students can connect with each other. With this survey the goal was to gather your preferences for such a platform and feedback on the existing Uni-Life app.

Survey Insights

- Out of 65 students, 61 expressed a strong interest in learning more about TU Delft events. The least interest was shown in "Events in other cities" (9 responses).
- 74% of respondents would like to have access to a campus community platform. Incoming students are eager to meet their peers and current students for guidance before and after joining the university, and this interest is shared by those already studying at the university.
- Regarding the usage of the Unilife app, only 3 out of 65 respondents use it. A larger group of 25 have the app on their phones but rarely use it, and the majority were unaware of the app's existence.
- In terms of usage, the app isn't checked daily by anyone. Out of the three people surveyed, one uses it weekly, another monthly, and the third only occasionally. They assigned an average rating of 6 to the Uni-Life app.

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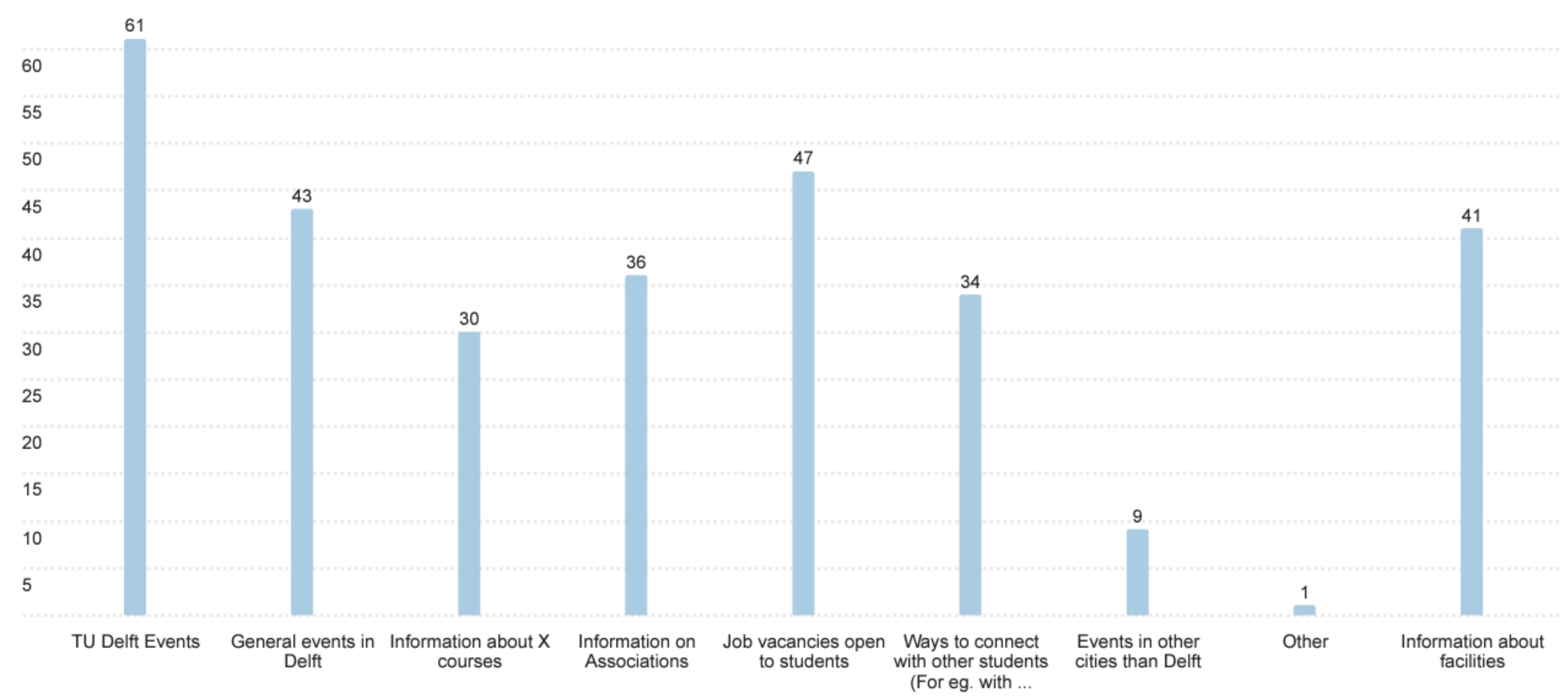
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Q1 – What information would you like to see on a community campus platform?

- 15 out of 65 responses mentioned that they can ask questions to those already enrolled and connect with peers who will be joining them for their studies. The enrolled students were eager to assist the incoming students to ensure a smooth transition.
- Ten responses indicated a strong interest in learning more about the university, including study associations, activities, and facilities.
 Additionally, they expressed a desire to explore the city to find better housing options.
- Three responses also mentioned that they would appreciate having a preview of upcoming events, as it would give them a better understanding of the types of activities and events that are held. This would help them feel more engaged and prepared for what to expect.

- Some respondents felt they didn't need pre-study activities or platforms. They had enough connections, found all necessary information easily available or preferred inperson interactions during orientation events like the OWee.
- Others mentioned that platforms like
 WhatsApp and Reddit already fulfill the
 role of connecting with peers and asking
 questions. Additionally, while some found
 value in orientation events, others felt they
 didn't miss out by not engaging before
 starting their studies.

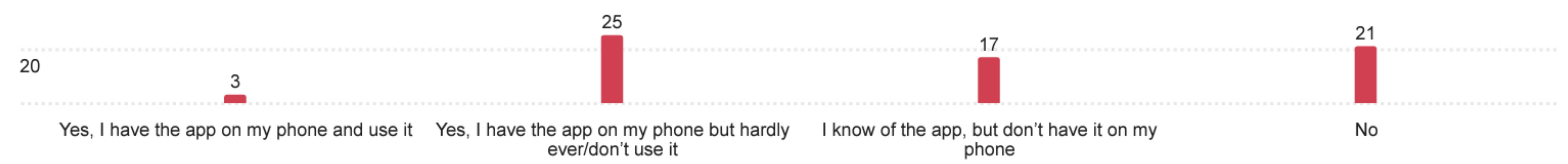
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Q3 – Do you know the app unilife, where events for TU Delft students can be found?
