## Topic of research

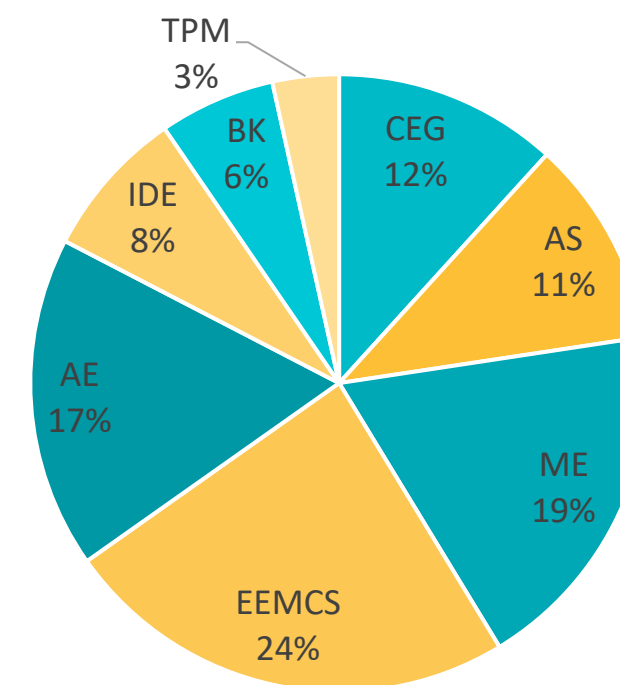
At TU Delft, we want to create a socially safe environment. With this survey, we wanted to know what students think is important in their interactions with others and where they think we can improve. The purpose of this survey was to support the development of shared guidelines of student social conduct at TU Delft.

## Survey Insights

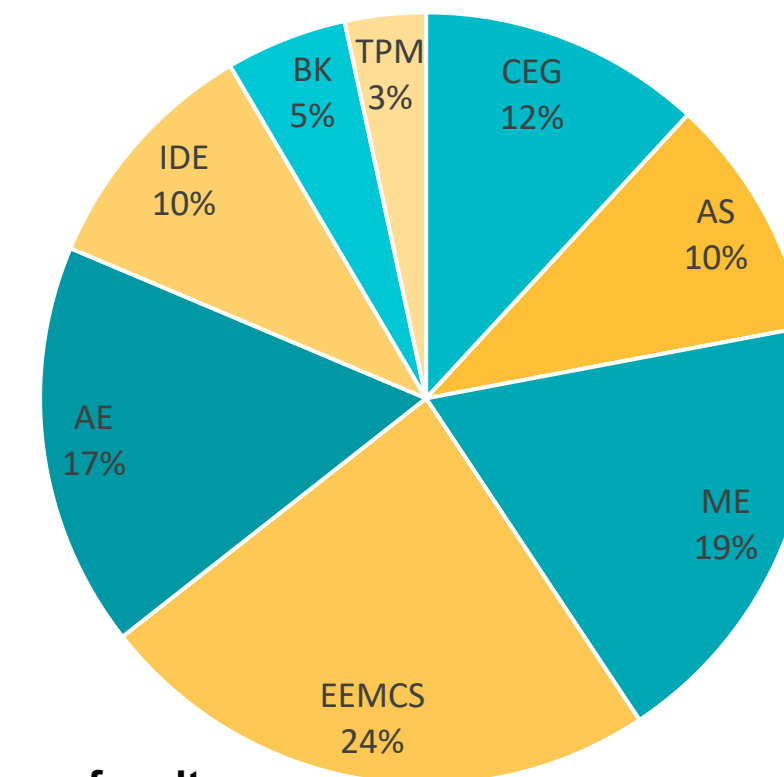
- According to students, the most important factors contributing to the feeling of social safety are **respect, equality, and listening**.
- Students would like to see **more respect, openness, and understanding** in the way that students treat each other.
- When asked about what could be improved at TU Delft regarding social safety, the main response from students is **inclusivity**. Also, **collaboration and direction** were mentioned as important points of improvement.
- **Feeling respected, feeling safe, and having trust** contribute a lot to a sense of safety for most students (74% out of 58 respondents, 81% out of 57 respondents, and 72% out of 57 respondents respectively).

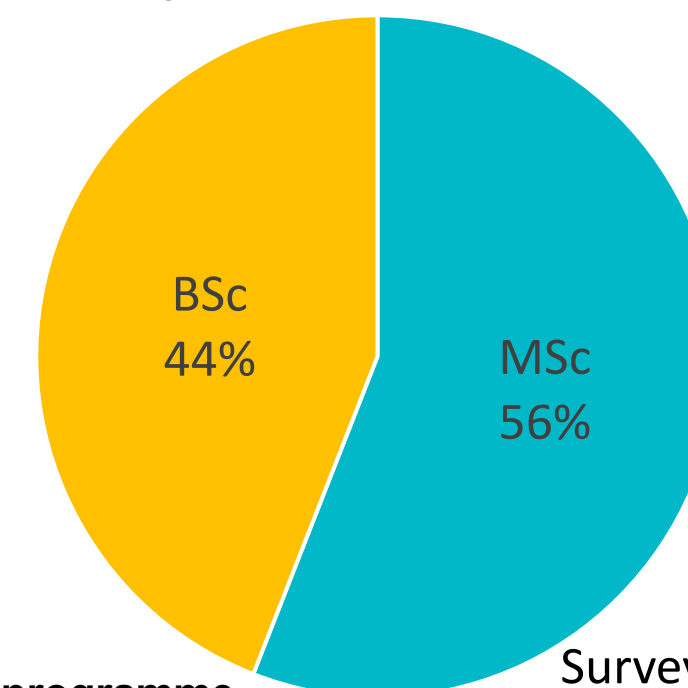
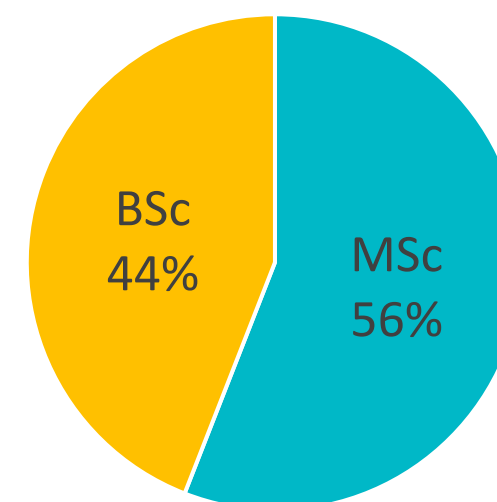
All Student Panel Members (230)
