

Transition from the Bachelor or Pre-Master to the CEG Master programs 2021-2022.

On 16 May 2022, the Executive Board decided to allow another temporary measure for the transition from the bachelor to the master.

Content of the transition measure

For Bachelor and Pre-Master students who are enrolled in the academic year 2021-2022 in a Bachelor program at a Dutch higher education institution, or a Pre-Master program to a (interfaculty) Master program at CEG, the following principles apply for the transition to a (interfaculty) Master program of the CEG faculty:

For Bachelor students:

- Bachelor students who have a deficit of no more than 10 EC* in Bachelor courses of their examination program on 31 August 2022, may take Master courses and exams of Master courses in the 2022-2023 academic year.
- * The additional requirement for all (interfaculty) programmes of CEG (AES, CE, ENV, CME and TIL) is that the bachelor thesis has to be successfully completed. All students must have fulfilled this requirement by 31 August 2022
- The option to take Master courses without having completed a Bachelor program will expire on 31 August 2023.

For Pre-Master students:

- Pre-Master students who have a deficit of no more than 10 EC in their Pre-Master programme on 31 August 2022 may enrol in Master courses and participate in examinations of Master courses in the 2022-2023 academic year.
- The option to enrol in Master courses without having completed the Pre-Master programme will expire on 31 August 2023.

Supplementary Provisions

Students can only have an enrolment under these transition rules for a (Pre-master or Master) program once and for a maximum duration of 1 year. Stacking two enrolments under these transition rules is therefore not possible.

Results achieved in the academic year 2022-2023 in one of our Master programs will be added to the MSc examination program as soon as there is a valid enrolment for the relevant MSc program.

The Master courses that the BSc student will take in 2022-2023 are subject to the Teaching Regulations (TER) / Annex of the (interfaculty) Master programs of the CEG faculty for the academic year 2022-2023. These can be found [here](#) from September 2022.
