Because of the measures taken to limit the spread of the Corona virus, several exams at TU Delft have been postponed. As a result, some students may not be able to fulfil all programme obligations before the greenlight meeting takes place and a date for the final presentation is set.<sup>[1]</sup>

To prevent unnecessary delays, the Board of Examiners has, with the consent of the relevant directors of studies, decided to permit students to have their greenlight meeting and their final presentation/MSc thesis defence as of 22 April 2020 under the following conditions:

- A maximum of 10 uncompleted EC, if these exams could not take place due to Corona related measures. Please note that these courses are **not** exempted, but have to be passed at a later moment in order to receive the MSc diploma;
- The student e-mails the Board of Examiners (<u>BoardofExaminers-CEG@tudelft.nl</u> and the MSc coordinator and/or the director of studies in cc) with the following information:
  - \* student name.
  - \* student number,
  - \* study programme,
  - \* the (maximum of) 10 EC for which the exam result has not been obtained due to postponement of the examinations, with proof of the postponement (e.g. links to Brightspace page or copy of emails) and
  - \* the dates of the greenlight meeting and the final presentation.
- The diploma will not be issued until all components of the MSc programme have been completed.

This decision will remain in force for the remainder of the academic year 2019-2020, up to and including 31 August 2020 and will be published on Brightspace and on the Rules and Regulations website on 22 April 2020.
