



Dutch for non-native speakers (NT2) Dutch language Summer course 2024 Elementary 2

What do you do if you need a doctor? How can you buy a train or bus ticket? What are the opening hours for the shops and what kinds of schools can people attend in the Netherlands? These everyday subjects are dealt with in 'the Green Book', the textbook for beginners. The Green Book contains 43 texts. These texts include the 1200 most common words in the Dutch language, the words that you will use most often.

Elementary 2

During the Elementary 2 course the second part of the Green Book will be discussed. Also in this course the lessons are chiefly devoted to conversation practice. The objective is to simultaneously develop listening and speaking skills. You can be admitted to the course if you have finished the Elementary 1 course successfully or after a placement test.

Programme

July 1 st – July 23 rd	daily morning classes (14 classes) Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday 9.30-11.00 hrs <u>or</u> 11.00-12.30 hrs Lessons will take place on the TU Delft campus.
July 29 th	final test on the TU Delft campus if necessary (exact time to be confirmed).
Study load	20 hrs a week (homework and classes). Please be sure that you have enough time to devote to your homework!
