



TU Delft must be able to verify the content and authenticity of the document(s), therefore certified document(s) are required.

Certified copy:

A copy is certified when it has a physical wet stamp and signature provided by the awarding institute (your university/competent authority) as proof that it is an identical copy of the original document (your diploma/statement).

Certified digital document:

Certified digital documents are accepted in the following ways:

- degree/statement shared via the secure electronic system of the issuing educational institution
- degree/statement that includes a verification code, QR code or link to be used on the website of the educational institution
- degree/statement shared via a third-party electronic system if this system is mentioned on the website of the issuing educational institution

We are only able to do so if the instructions and output are in English.

TU Delft does not use paid services or download software to verify credentials on your behalf.

Certified translation:

A certified translation can be issued by either your educational institution or a sworn translator. The document needs a physical wet stamp and signature provided by the educational institution/competent authority.
