Tips and tricks for questions during an online open day

(Online) open days are useful if you do not yet know which of the many university courses you want to study. The university's teachers and students can tell you a lot about the institution and the different studies. You will receive presentations and online lectures. Before you visit an open day at one or more universities, we advise you to think carefully about which information is important to you. If you have no idea yet, read the questions below and ask them during the presentations to the teacher or to students through Unibuddy.

- Which courses do you take during the first year?
- Which specializations / Masters are there?
- In what ways are tests performed and how often?
- Is the training mainly practical or more theoretical?
- Is it an independent study or do you work together a lot?
- How many lecture hours or contact hours do you have per week?
- What is the teaching form (lectures, practical sessions, workgroups, tutorials, seminars)?
 - What does the study choice check (misschien een link of als webadres?) look like? How can you prepare for this?
 - What characteristics and qualities do you need to successfully complete the study?
 - What can I do to orient myself on this study furthermore?
 - Is there a pre-selection for the study? If so, what are the selection criteria?
- How is study guidance arranged?
- How many students are there in the first year?
- How many students drop out? And why?
- In which professions do most students end up?
- Can you study abroad during the course?
- How does this study program differ from the same study program at another university?
