The Delft Young Academy DYA is a platform for the development of academic leadership and of cooperation between early career academics. Future leaders of TU Delft should be capable to think beyond the borders of their own discipline and faculty. The DYA can prepare early career academics for their future roles.

The DYA helps to build a university wide network of scientists and a network of external stakeholders (e.g., KNAW, NWO, OCW). This allows members more opportunities to influence academic policy at university, national and international level.

Our activities:

Topical lunches

DYA topical lunches are informal lunches with a predetermined discussion topic and invited speakers. DYA lunches offer the DYA community a chance to get to know each other and discuss relevant topics in a safe environment. Lunches are organized at different faculties to physically visit different faculty buildings. At the event, DYA board members provide updates about the work of the association, and members have the opportunity to give feedback. Lunch is provided.





Activities for the sub-communities

Within the larger community of early-career researchers, there are several subcommunities that have specific aspects of their professional and personal life that they want to explore and discuss, or that encounter specific issues and challenges that are not encountered by most others. For these sub- communities, targeted activities are planned. For example, in the first half of 2023 the DYA teamed-up with the TU Delft post-doc network to organise a well-attended event targeting that community, focused on career opportunities outside academia. Other events on many different topics are in the pipeline!






