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

Ethics in the EU - Framework



Three aims:

- To respect legal obligations
- To respect ethical principles in research
- To help researchers think about and elaborate on the ethics aspects of their projects



What is new in Ethics H2020



- Legal base
 - → Art.19 in H2020 Regulation (EU) n°1291/2013
 - → Art. 13 & 14 Rules for Participation Regulation (EU) n°1290/2013
- List of ethics issues
 - → ERC Rules for Submission in H2020 Decision C(2014)2454
- Ethics procedure
 - → Ethics Appraisal (Ethics Review in ERCEA)
- Ethics in submission system
 - → Integral part of the proposal (part A)
- New templates
 - → EIT ethics issues table

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Deal with the proposals and follow emerging trends in ethics

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


Ethics Review procedure in ERCEA



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Three actors involved



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clears the projects



What is expected from the applicant? (Ethics Self-Assessment – PDF)



- Describes the potential ethical issues raised by the proposed action in relation to its objectives; the methodology and the possible implications of its results;
- Explains how the ethical requirements set out in the work programme will be fulfilled;
- Indicates how the proposal meets the national legal and ethical requirements of the EU and/or the country where the action is performed.





Data protection and anonymisation

Data protection; type of data; methodology

- Personal data
- Big data
- Data merging
- Public and freely useable data

Anonymisation

- → Anonymisation
- Pseudonymisation
- Codification





Informed consent

Oral and written consent

- Illiterate individuals
- Oral tradition countries
- Risks of written consent

Children involved in research

- Information sheet and assent
- Reconsenting when turning adults

Vulnerable populations

- → Free will of university students as research subjets
- → Financially vulnerable populations and use of incentives





Misuse of results

Aim of the research

Possible distortion of the facts by the methodology used

Discrimination and stigmatisation

→ During research and/or dissemination of results

Misinterpretation of results

Preventing wrong political use of results
