# Organisation

- MISS: make it simple stupid! 4,6
- Schedule the activities & breaks 1,2,3,5,10
- Plan (enough) time for interaction
- Limit the screen hours & video time 3,4
- Give different types of (small) tasks 1,9,10
- Plan deliverables: assignments and responsibilities 3,5,10
- Feedback: <u>be available</u>, prepared and willing to adjust 1,2,3,4,5,7
- Involve the teachers in the changes
- Avoid Overload and Competition 2

Need No Grading!
But any type of feedback

Answer fast! Lower treshold, eg whatsapp 6



# Lecturing

"freezing" is a threat to being "live"

- Choose between Live or Recorded: preferences differ 1,2,5,6,7
- If recorded, have live Q&A 1,4
- Avoid "talking ppts" 1,2
- Keep it short! Max 7, 15, 20, 30 min? 1,4,6,10

Live: be clear on when (moment in session) and how (punch in, raise hand, ...) to accept questions<sub>9,13</sub>

Ask each participant a question during the lecture/session

(keep participant list at hand!)

Try to stay as close to normal as possible



# Active Teaching and Active Learning

### is a challenge.

- At the start: if possible meet each other on campus. 1,2,8
- Facilitate informality: exercise to get to know each other 1,3
- Listen and refer: collect issues and refer to tools (TU platform)
- Train discussion and (online) collaboration techniques 3,4
- Make it personal (stylos) 1,2,3,5,9
- Use Peer feedback 1,5,9
- Organise a Helpdesk (consultation hour) discussions, etc
- Senior students teaching/tutoring younger students
- Alternative examination methods 4,12



Use breakout rooms, smaller assignment, questions, discussions, etc

4. BETHE BRIDGE

As a teacher, you embody the link between the students and the world of science and practice; use your professional experience in education.

Zoom is a good 2nd 2

Zoom Webinars 13
More quite, besides Chat Q&A, panel, poll

- Talking PPT is a quick solution 2,7,8 but SEE each other 1,3
- ZOOM/VC/etc "work" 1,2,6
- Use 2 systems as teacher 9

Or have a separate host 9,13

- Post class rules and agenda on the wall (and indicate where you are)
   Inventory issues in questionnaire 8
- Use Break-out rooms: better discussions, less fatigue 1,2,9
- Experiment: many options, find what is suitable 2,3
   eg. VC is directive, ZOOM interactive
- Miro and Mural (possible online collaboration platforms)
- Discussion platforms (as in BS) 9
- Have "written" q's in big groups 1
