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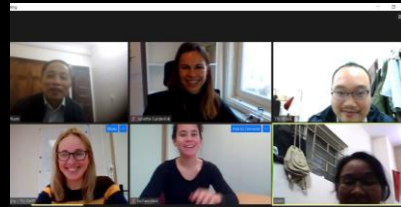
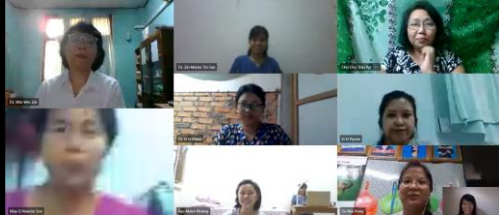
New beginnings

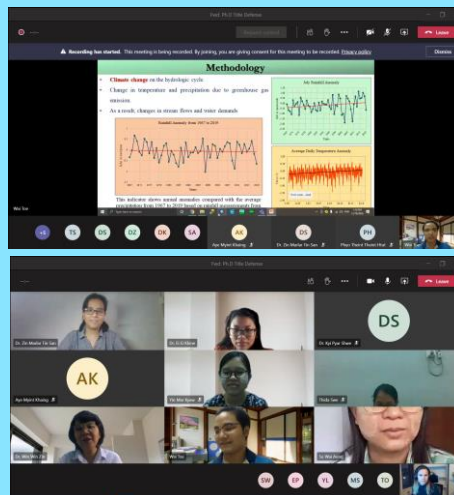
Start-up event SV.Startup at Thuyloi University

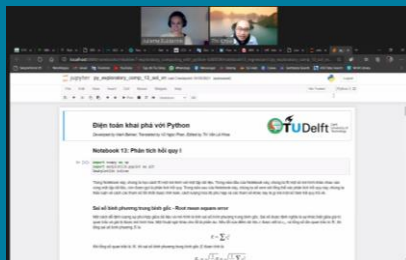

Introducing Google Classroom

One of our focal points in the OKP program is the digitization of educational materials. This allows for long term use and quality control. Sharing is easiest on an educational sharing platform. Therefore we have launched our 'learning by doing' Google Classroom tutorial.

Google Classroom is easy and free to use. It allows the sharing of documents, videos, messages and many other materials with your students. It stores your files on Google Drive, allowing safe-keeping in case your computer crashes. There is furthermore a 'stream' which works sort of like Facebook, allowing you to update (i.e. send messages to) your students or other staff. We encourage each one of you to start creating your virtual classroom. You can even use the app on your phone to manage your classroom.

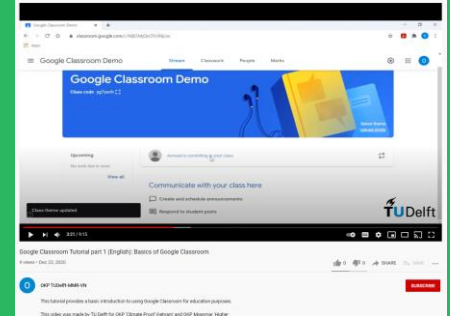
